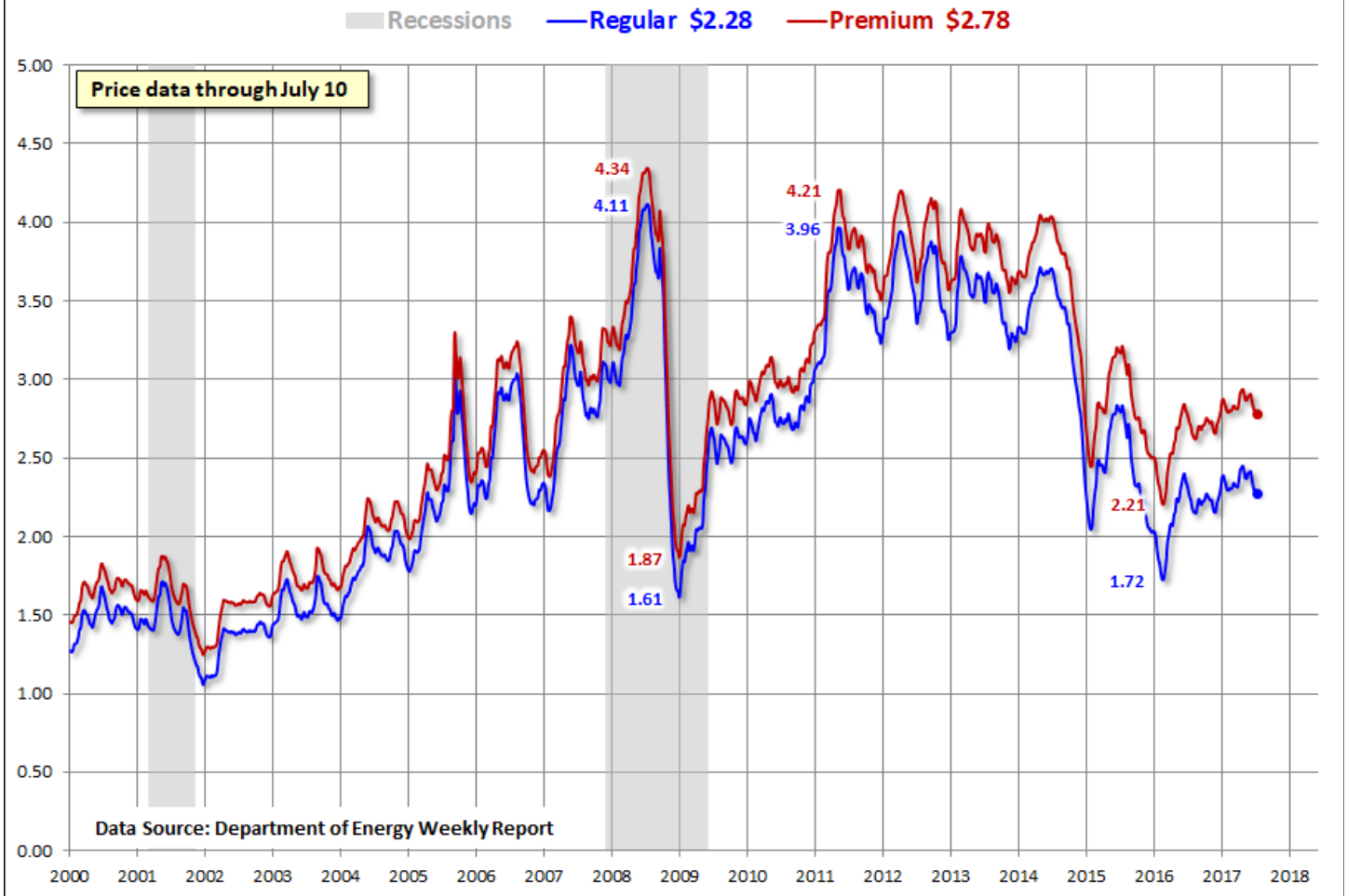

It's time again for our weekly gasoline update based on data from the Energy Information Administration (EIA). The price of Regular and Premium are down two cents a piece from last week. According to GasBuddy.com, Hawaii has the highest average price for Regular at \$2.99 and San Francisco, CA is the most expensive city, averaging \$3.05. South Carolina has the cheapest at \$1.95. The WTIC end of day spot price closed at 46.02, a 3.6% increase from this time last week.

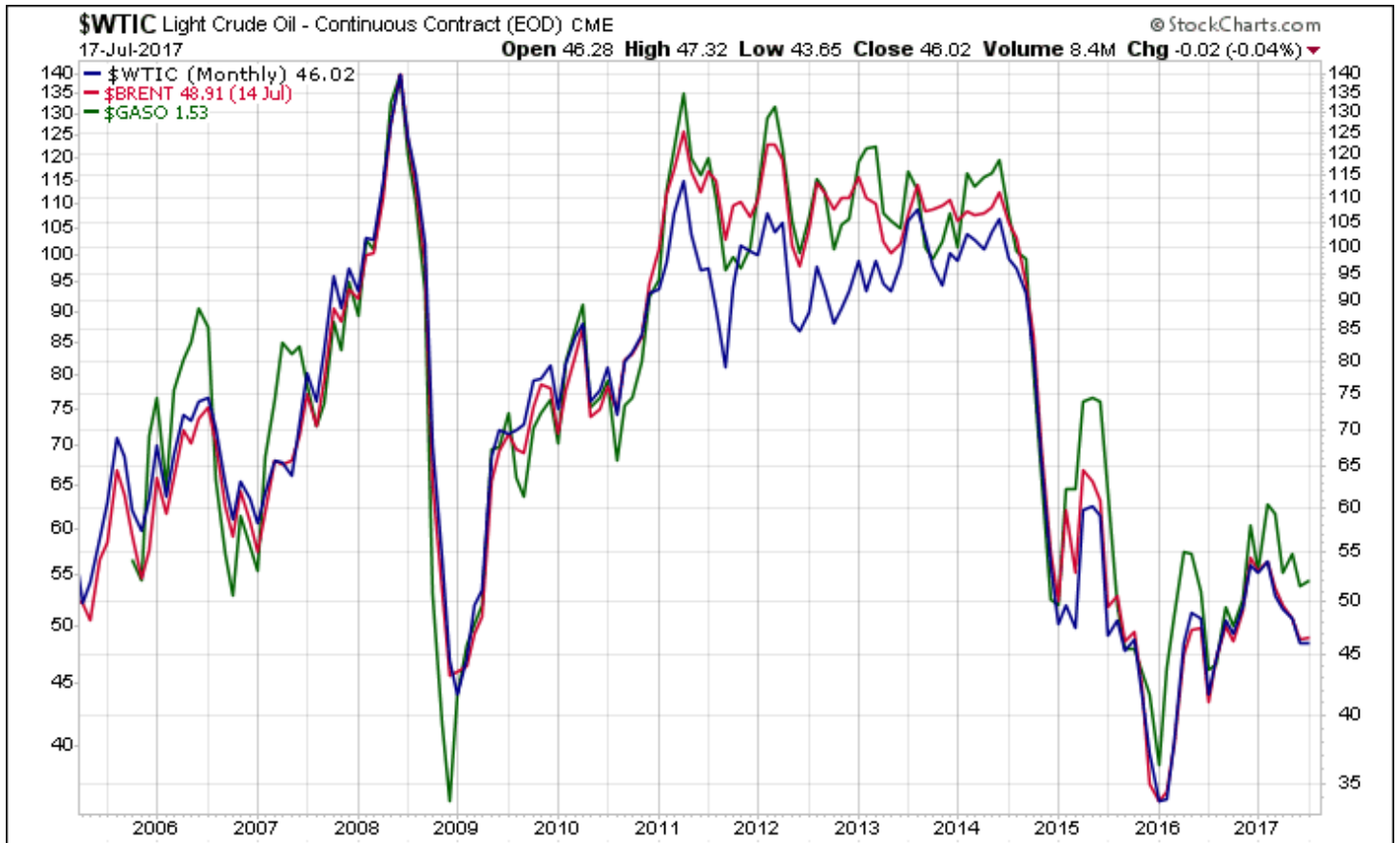

The next chart is a monthly chart overlay of West Texas Light Crude, Brent Crude, and unleaded gasoline end-of-day spot prices (GASO).



In this monthly chart, WTIC end of day spot price closed at 46.02, up 3.6% from this time last week.

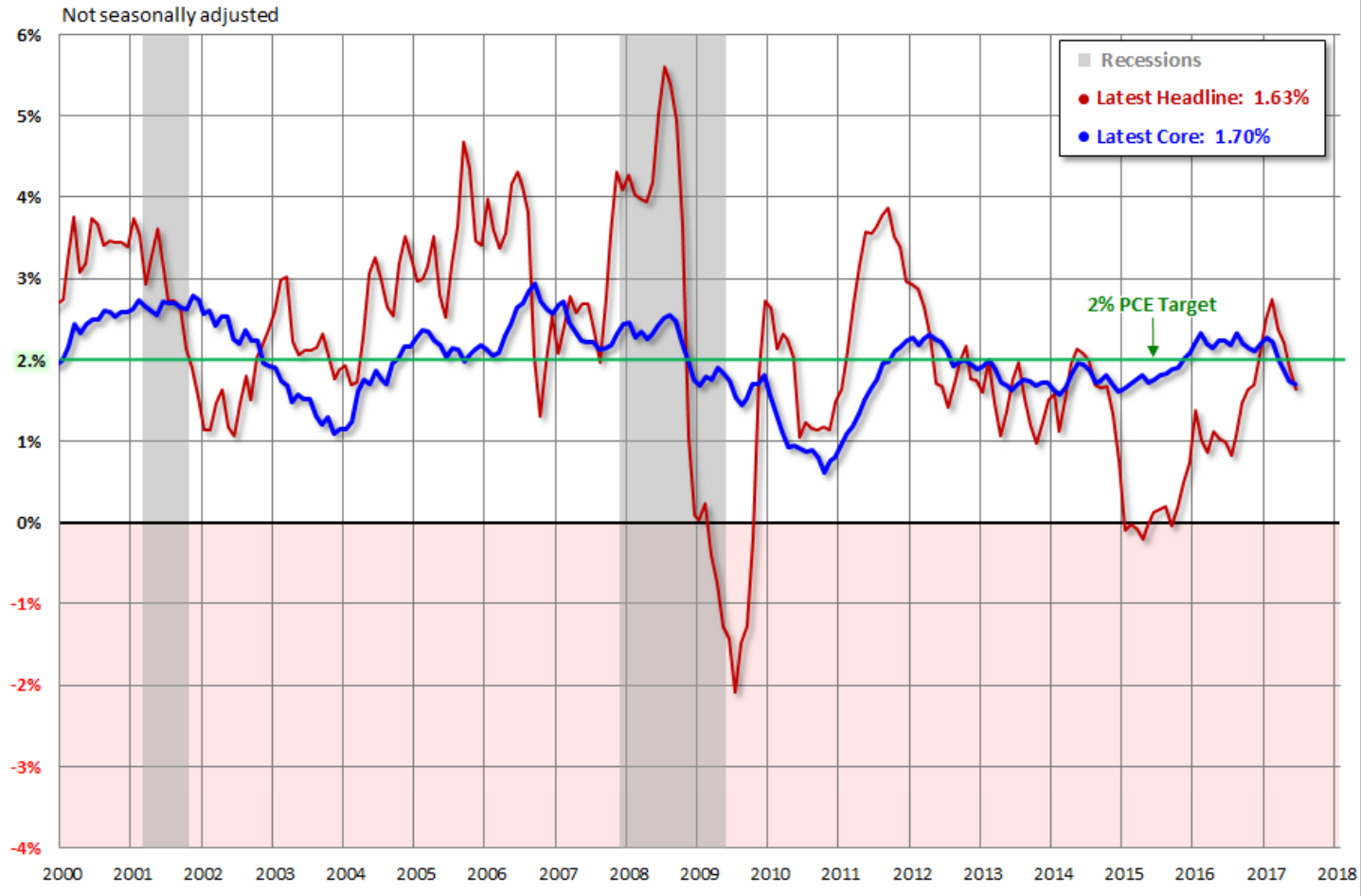

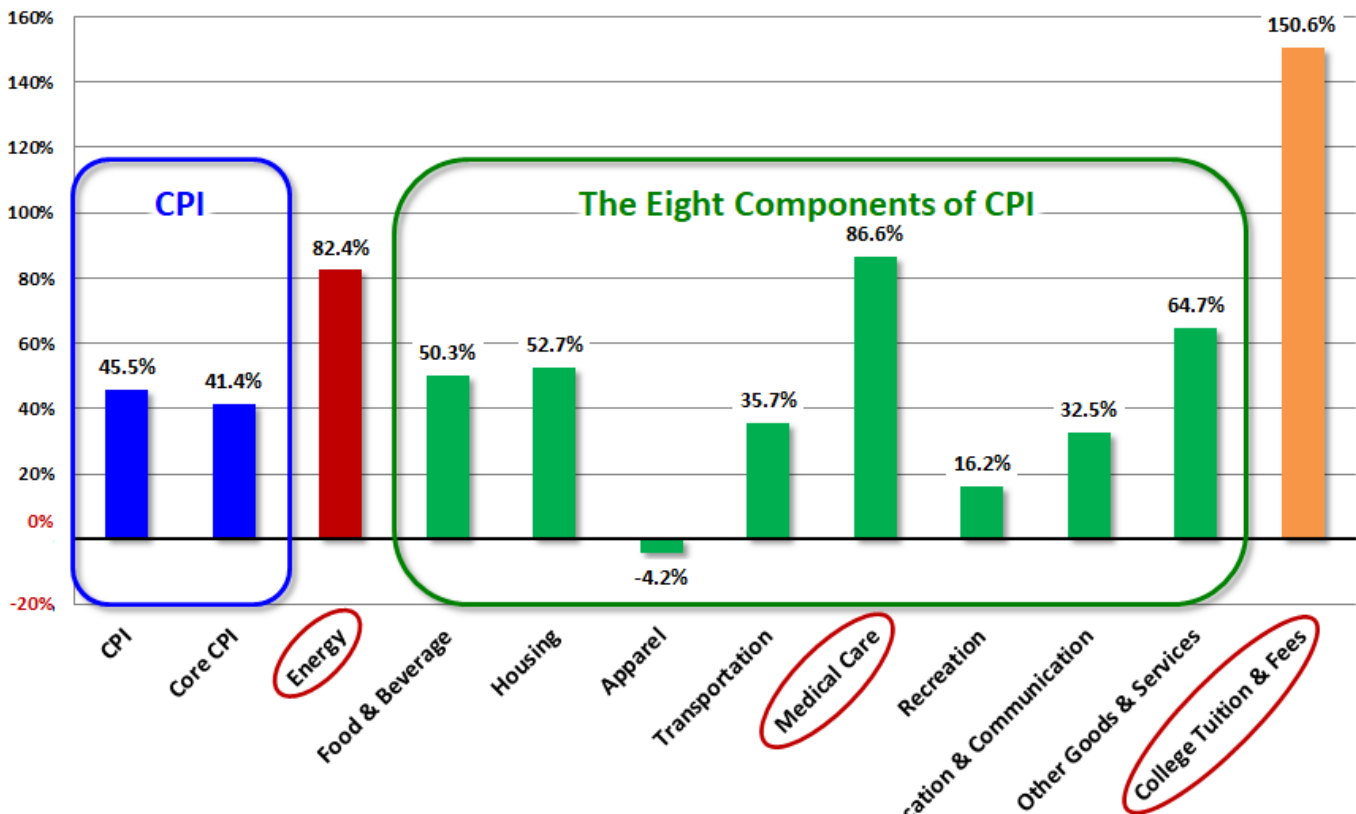


The chart below offers a comparison of the broader aggregate category of energy inflation since 2000, based on categories within Consumer Price Index (commentary here).

The green bars are the eight components of CPI. Core CPI excludes Food and Energy. Energy is a major subcomponent of Transportation and a minor subcomponent of Housing. College Tuition & Fees is a subcomponent of Education & Communication.
